Fines and punitive damages are not for the individual victims or sufferers of the injurious consequences of an activity under the control or within the jurisdiction of the State, hence its liability for compensation and answerability for future recurrences of the harmful effects. Fines are not advanced payment for future damage or suffering but should contribute to preventive or pre-emptive measures. (a) State responsibility is based on the existence of an internationally wrongful act attributable to the State. Such an act could be an action or omission. under certain circumstances, the courts may judge a person liable for harm even though that person was not negligent and did not commit an intentional tort. defective condition. a product that is unreasonably dangerous to the user, to the consumer, or property. cybertort. involves the invasion, distortion, theft, falsification, misuse, destruction, or exploitation of information stored in or related to electronic devices. preserve the right to bring a lawsuit only if the death is cause by the negligence or the intentional conduct of the person who caused the death. statutes of repose. establish a limit in years, usually but not necessarily 15 years, beyond which an injured party could not bring a lawsuit for an injury caused by a product. paradigm. under internal the internal revenue, wherein a district attorney shall appear for the purpose of prosecuting or defending, it shall be the duty of said attorney, instead of reporting to the solicitor of the treasury, immediately at the end of every term of the court in which said suit or proceeding is or shall. such rules and regulations, not inconsistent with law, for the observance shall respecting of revenue officers, district attorneys and marshals, respecting suits arising under the internal revenue laws, in which the United States is a party, as may be deemed necessary for the just responsibility of those officers and the prompt collection of all revenues and debts due and accruing to the United States under such laws. to have charge SEC.
