Hurricane Hugo was the eighth named storm, sixth hurricane, and second major hurricane of the 1989 Atlantic hurricane season. Hugo was the last in a series of Cape Verde hurricanes during mid-August and early September across the eastern tropical Atlantic. Hugo briefly attained Category 5 status on the Saffir-Simpson Hurricane Scale before lashing the islands of the northeastern Caribbean Sea as a strong Category 4.
