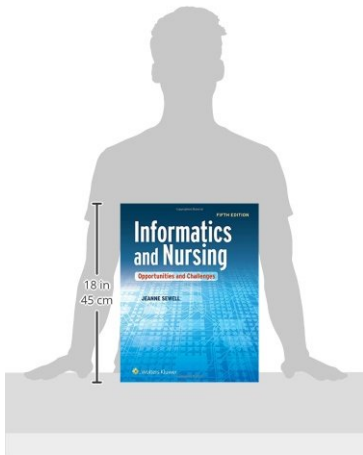

Based on literature, the term "nursing informatics" was first used and defined by Scholes and Barber in 1980 while addressing participants attending MEDINFO conference in Tokyo (Sewell & Thede, 2013).
