The Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act of 1974 (JJDP) is a United States federal law providing formula grants to states that follow a series of federal protections on the care and treatment of youth in the juvenile justice and criminal justice systems. The JJDP, as amended, contains four "core protections" or "core mandates" for youth: "Deinstitutionalization/Deincarceration of Status Offenders" (DSO) - Generally prohibits the detention of status offenders and non-offenders (i.e., youth Permanency Planning Committee Medicaid Eligibility Development Assistance Domestic Violence Community Corrections. Delinquent youth can be sentenced to a local detention facility for 15 days or less within a given year. Detention may be used as a sanction for probation or aftercare violations.
