When news of the budding romance between a beloved English prince and an American actress broke, it captured the world's attention and sparked an international media frenzy. But while the Duke and Duchess of Sussex have continued to make headlines from their engagement, wedding, and birth of their son Archie to their unprecedented decision to step back from their royal lives, few know the true story of Harry and Meghan. For the very first time, *Finding Freedom* goes beyond the headlines to reveal unknown details of Harry and Meghan's life together, dispelling the many rumors and misconceptions. *The Book of the Duchess*, also known as *The Death of Blanche*, is the earliest of Chaucer's major poems, preceded only by his short poem, "An ABC", and possibly by his translation of *The Romaunt of the Rose*. Based on the themes and title of the poem, most sources put the date of composition after 12 September 1368 (when Blanche of Lancaster died) and before 1372, with many recent studies privileging a date as early as the end of 1368. The Queen and the Duke of Edinburgh inspected Blood Swept Lands and Seas of Red at the Tower of London. Her Majesty looked sombre as she and Prince Philip, himself a former military man, toured the installation. When the Queen and Duke first arrived at the imposing Tower of London they were met by its Constable, General the Lord Dannatt, the former head of the British Army, and Colonel Richard Harrold, Governor of the medieval fortress. Precisely what happened to the two boys, who were aged 12 and nine years old at the time, has never been established, although many suspect that the children were murdered - either by their uncle Richard III or the incoming Tudor king, Henry VII.
