Consolidated Regulations of British Columbia. At the end of each legislative session, all new public Acts are consolidated and published by the Queen's Printer in looseleaf format on watermarked paper. The consolidation is assigned an "amendment" or "consolidation" number and cut-off date for publication. Any amendments to existing Acts, that are in force at the cut-off date, are included and are blended into the original text (consolidated).
